- Textbooks focus on inner circle varieties
- Research studies to raise awareness of students about the differences in local and international standards
- Local dialects to be part of English language classrooms

Q. Needs of regional dictionary

Macquarie Regional Asian English Dictionary co-published as the Grolier International Dictionary: World English in an Asian Context

- Aims to meet the needs of the English speakers in the region
- Includes items of international currency along with local words which have never appeared in a dictionary before
- Recognizes inter and intra national needs of IVE speakers

- Use of English as the dominant language in education and business
- Singapore's efforts to become a centre of academic excellence in research and a knowledge society.
- English is now acquired as a first language by many Singaporeans

- The range and depth differs from context to context
- Used by a small number of people despite being the official language (e.g. Namibia) in some cases
- In others used by a large number of population (Liberia, Zimbabwe, South Africa)
- Has made a mark on the language use in Africa, despite relatively shorter period of colonization
- Enjoys a lot of power and prestige

- Language policy revolves around the role of English
- The functionality of English is recognized and accepted

Q. Define foreign language .3

English achieves a special role when it is made a priority in a country's foreign-language teaching policy; it has no official status, but it is nonetheless the foreign language which children are most likely to encounter when they arrive at school. Over 100 countries treat English as a foreign language (chiefly in Europe, Asia, North Africa, and Latin America).

The circle where English is learned and used as a foreign language is known as the expanding circle. It encompasses large parts of the world where English is learned as a foreign language because it is found useful, or indeed indispensable, for international contacts.

Q. After independence declaration about national and official language in Pakistan:

The 1973 constitution includes the following two clauses:

1. The English language may be used for official purposes until arrangements are made for its replacement by Urdu.
2. A Provincial Assembly may by law prescribe measures for the teaching, promotion and use of a provincial language in addition to the national language (Rahman, 2003)

General Zia's Urduization policy:

Implementation of Urdu as the medium of instruction in all government schools from class one. Political influence led to the continuation of the elite English medium schools.

General Musharraf's policy:

English language was made compulsory from class one onwards. English was introduced as a medium of instruction for science, Mathematics, Computer sciences and other selected subjects. The policy faced a deadlock due to the unavailability of English teachers.

English widely spread and is almost like the first language of all Pakistanis. The choice of language- education in our country is a result of political expediency rather than of educational effectiveness.

Language tests do not represent English varieties spoken and used in contact situations. Inappropriacy of target norms in local contexts. Language tests do not represent English varieties spoken and used in contact situations. Tests developed in one setting may be invalid for another setting. Language testing reflects the 'deficit linguistics' view. Testing is based on how close the language use is to the native speaker norms

Adaptations and innovations that show the European influence on the spread of English.

European English

- Intra-European communication
- Distinctly European uses of English
- Distinguish European English speakers from speakers of other varieties

Bilingual women make language choices to:

- 1) Meet the needs of their speech community.
- 2) Ensure better future for themselves and their families.
- 3) Strengthen the status of English in world communities.

English-speaking bilingual women are considered as innovators of language change

They help in advancing the progress of English and gaining acceptance and importance along with regional dialects. Women play a key role in the transmission of English in world contexts and in constructing new identities.

Q. Explain the phenomenon of linguistic imperialism in details(5)

Spread of English is equated with linguistic imperialism. It is a sort of imposition of one language on speakers of other languages. "Linguistic imperialism assumes the active promotion of the language by the dominant class as an active expression of power of the powerful over the powerless." (Phillipson, 1992). "The dominance asserted and maintained by the establishment and continuous reconstitution of structural and cultural inequalities between English and other languages." (Phillipson, 2006). Dominance of English is considered as letting or facilitating cultural, economic, and sociopolitical hegemony of Anglo- and Eurocentric views over the rest of the world

Paradox of linguistic imperialism:

- Linguistic imperialism as an outdated concept
- English as a tool empowerment and emancipation
- Widespread demand for more access to English

Q. Ethnic varieties involves language shift by a minority groups Justify? (5)

- A result of immigration
- Produced by language contact
- Involves language shift on by a minority group from an ethnic language to English
- Involve modification of the dominant language
- Example: African American English (AAE),
- Perceived as homogeneous
- A strong degree of mixing, mutual accommodation, and koinéization
- Dialect studies show a great deal of phonetic, lexical, and grammatical variability
- No nationally uniform standard accent of American English
- Diversity has replaced homogeneity

Native speakers as teachers [Download More Files from VUAnswer.com](#)

- Confusion between ENL and the teaching of English as a second language
- A native speaker assumed to have the expertise to teach English
- Lack the experience of having learned a language
- Lack pedagogical training

Non-native teachers

- Non-native speakers share the language learning experience with their students
- Awareness about appropriating and adapting a foreign language
- The learning experience is a useful resource for non-native teacher
- Having learned the English language is considered a weakness of non-native teachers

- The policy was changed due to unavailability of teachers
- English was introduced in higher grades
- In 1996, English was reintroduced as a subject
- Taught from Grade 1 to 12

- Authority on almost all aspects of a language
- Source of confidence for the users of the language
- Source of reassurance about the legitimacy of a variety
- Does not provide recognition to the people as users of English
- Acknowledges the variety of English used by these people

- A reference accent
- First colonial variety of British English
- Has undergone a process of linguistic and cultural appropriation
- A result of colonial expansion of the British Empire.
- Stable and influential because of longer association with sociopolitical developments
- A history of in-migration
- Shows effects of language contact

Q. Role of mother tongue in classroom

- Appeals from the inner circle English language teaching establishment for more use of the mother tongue in the classroom
- The use of the mother tongue in the classroom considered one dimension of linguistic human rights.
